Follow in the footsteps of legends. As the home of golf, St Andrews is the oldest and most iconic golf course in the world. The Swilcan Bridge and Hell Bunker are recognized across the globe, yet the greatest feature of the Old Course is that despite its grand status it remains a public golf course, open to all. The Open Championship has been hosted at St. Andrews 29 times, more than any other course. St. Andrews was also the first course to host the Open Championship on an 18-hole course, instead of three rounds of 12 holes, there were two rounds of 18.
